WHAT WE DO

Believing recovery is possible, our mission is to strengthen and support families affected by addiction.

FAMILY PROGRAMMING

The Family Restored Support Groups

The Family Support Group is an interactive and educational support group for families coping with a loved one's addiction. Family members have the opportunity to ask questions, discuss their concerns, and build community with other families in a supportive and non-judgmental environment. Meetings are facilitated by people in recovery who provide a unique and insightful first-hand account of addiction. They provide an honest perspective on how to approach addiction and strive to inspire hope. This year, The Family Restored has partnered with The Sun Will Rise Foundation to offer grief support groups to anyone who has experienced the death of a loved one due to substance use (drug/alcohol) or overdose.

Attending TFR family support groups provided us with a safe place to share our fears without any judgement as well as knowing that everyone present could relate to our story. Beyond that we learned how to take care of ourselves, that we couldn't control our loved one's behavior and most importantly, how to set boundaries and separate ourselves from their chaos. Nothing about it was easy but there was support every step of the way.

12 Step Workshops for Family Members

TFR offers intensive step workshops where families are taken through the Big Book of Alcoholics Anonymous by people in recovery and begin the process of writing their 4th step inventory. The purpose of this workshop is to guide families through their own spiritual work, providing them with their own experience in the 12 steps.



Family Retreats

We believe that helping families create bonds with other families is paramount to their recovery. Our family retreats allow family members to spend positive time together, practice self care by taking a weekend for themselves in a supportive environment, and re-learn who they are independent of their loved one.

Family Peer Coaching

We aim to give family members support in becoming empowered to make their own wellness a priority. We believe that in supporting the entire family unit, recovery is possible.

This program matches family members who are seeking support with a peer coach who will work with them one-on-one. We provide the training program for family members who are interested in becoming a peer coach, and supervision and continued training is offered for coaches over the course of their commitment. The role of a peer coach is to support a family member in their own recovery path, goals and wellness plan.

RECOVERY PROGRAMMING

Scholarships for Treatment and Recovery Housing

You have given me the chance to live again. I have so much love land appreciation for TFR. When I moved up here I was homeless, I needed and wanted the structure and guidance sober living has to offer. Thank you for assisting me with finding recovery and entering this next chapter of my life. The Family Restored scholarship program was founded to provide housing and treatment opportunities for those seeking 12-step, abstinence-based treatment. Secure, stable housing remains one of the biggest barriers to recovery, especially for people who choose a pathway of 12-step, abstinence-based treatment, which traditional insurance does not always cover.

In 2023 TFR awarded \$146,781 in scholarships to 116 individuals seeking recovery.

12 Step Program

The Family Restored is offering a free resource to the community to help recovery newcomers get through the first chapters of the book of Alcoholics Anonymous and prepared to write a 4th step in a timely manner. Through our own experiences in recovery, we know that going through the steps outside of inpatient treatment can be a time consuming process. We believe the sooner someone can begin the work, the better off they are in early recovery.

All new residents, community members, those looking for a refresher or those preparing to sponsor are welcome. This program takes place in our office in Stevens Square Community Center and is led by staff and volunteers. After the two weeks of groups, there is availability for inventory check-in as needed.

Portland Sober Living

Portland Sober Living has earned a reputation of providing over 6 years of high quality, 12-Step focused recovery housing in Portland, Maine. PSL is a 10-bed facility that offers structure and accountability to help motivate residents to grow towards their personal and recovery goals. We emphasize mental, physical, and spiritual transformation through a 12-Step experience in order to achieve a fulfilled, long-lasting life in recovery.

Personal Enrichment Scholarships

The Family Restored is offering Personal Enrichment Scholarships, specially designed for individuals in recovery. Our aim is to support people in early recovery on their journeyy to rediscovering themselves after addiction.




